Arthur S. Ding, also known as Shuhfan Ding, is a Visiting Senior Research Fellow at the S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies (RSIS) of Nanyang Technological University between August 2007 and March 2008. Prior to his visiting at the RSIS, Dr. Ding is a Research Fellow at the Institute of International Relations of National Chengchi University, Taipei, Taiwan.

Arthur Ding's research focuses on China security and Taiwan-China related issues. He has published China's Military Theory in Change, 1978-1991 (1996) and China's Defense Industry Conversion (1996), and edited Political and Administration Reform during the Jiang Zemin Era (2002) and China's Development, 2003-2004 (2004), along with numerous referred articles. Currently, he is doing a research on innovation and China's defense industry reform.

Arthur Ding obtained his doctoral degree from Department of Political Science (formerly Department of Government and International Studies) of the University of Notre Dame in July 1987.
